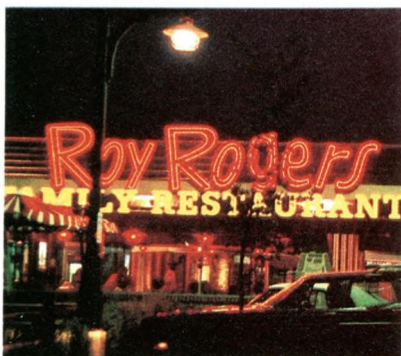

A View from the Top

On June 18-21, we will meet again in Biennial Convention at French Lick Springs, Indiana. We are looking forward to an outstanding convention, and we will be able to eat our meals together in one area and thus have further opportunities to renew our Brotherhood and deepen our fellowship.

Our Biennial Convention is the single most important event in the Fraternity program. It is the one occasion when representatives of all members of the Fraternity come together for current information on the status of the Fraternity and participate in the legislative decisions of the Fraternity. It is vitally important that each active chapter have an informed and prepared delegate in attendance at the Convention.

Information is sent in advance of the Convention to each chapter assigning its delegate to one of the panels which will discuss important Fraternity topics. Each delegate should come prepared to represent the views of his chapter on these topics and the changes in the Constitution and General Statutes which the Chapter desires to see effected. In addition to the voting delegate, chapters should arrange to have as many other members of their chapter as possible in attendance at the Convention in order to participate with Phis from all over the country.

It is equally important that alumni clubs and chapter advisers be represented, and when possible, alumni clubs are urged to look for some financial arrangement in order to send a nearby chapter adviser as the delegate of the alumni club. This would be a fitting recognition of his contribution of time and talent, and both he and the active chapter, and the General Fraternity, will all benefit from this participation.

Election of General Council

As we have mentioned in previous columns, an advisory committee has been established to make recommendations to the nominating committee, which is provided for in our General Statutes. This Advisory Committee has met, investigated and decided upon candidates for the General Council whom it will recommend to the Nominating Committee. Additional nominations can be made by the Nominating Committee or on the floor of the Convention in the manner prescribed in the code. The

committee has gathered biographical information on each candidate which will be distributed in advance by mail to each delegate, and also at the Convention.

During the Convention and before the election of the new General Council, time will be provided where the delegates can talk informally to each of the candidates who will be at a separate area in the Convention Hall. The purpose of this new procedure is to acquaint the delegates in advance with the basic facts of each candidate's college, fraternity and community service and to insure a selection based on merit in the eyes of the delegates.

It is hoped that due to our new procedure, all delegates, undergraduate and alumni, will be in a better position than ever to determine which of the candidates is best equipped by reason of experience, ability, and past contribution to serve the Fraternity. It should be noted that this new procedure will be used on a trial basis for our 1978 Convention and will thereafter be modified as may be indicated for future conventions.

Chapter Adviser of the Year

The Chapter Adviser of the Year for 1977 is Brother **Al Hromas** (Oklahoma St. '66). I join all Phis in saluting Brother **Hromas** for the great contribution he had made. The Chapter Adviser of the Year for 1978 will be announced at the Convention, and both of these men and their wives will attend the 1978 Convention as the guests of Phi Delta Theta. This honor reflects the deep appreciation we all have for the dedication of our chapter advisers who supply the key ingredient to motivate a chapter and thus maintain the heritage and tradition of the Fraternity in our current undergraduates. To all chapter advisers, we extend our profound thanks for their untiring work this past year.

General Officers Conference

The General Officers Conference was held in San Antonio February 3-5. This was a most worthwhile meeting for all those who attended and was concluded by a successful Founder's Day Dinner held Feb. 6 at the San Antonio Country Club and arranged by Brother **Glenn Foster** (Indiana '18).

We hope to see as many of you as possible at French Lick Springs, Indiana! ■

It All Started With A Root Beer Stand

1927 was a year of greatness . . . and excitement.

Lindbergh became the first person to fly across the Atlantic. Babe Ruth thrilled the sports world by swatting 60 home runs. The first talking motion picture, Al Jolson's "The Jazz Singer", was released. Television passed its first public test. Thornton Wilder's "The Bridge of San Luis Rey" won a Pulitzer Prize and the nation was singing to the songs of "Old Man River" and "Blue Skies."

On May 21, 1927—the day that "Lucky Lindy" landed in Paris—another important, yet unnoticed event took place. **J. Willard Marriott** (Utah '25) opened an A&W root beer stand in Washington, D.C.

Thus was born a famous commercial institution. **Marriott** recalled years later that "we selected Washington because we'd heard it got real hot there in the summer."

A college sweetheart, Alice Sheets, whom he married in June, 1927, came to Washington with him to help in the new business. The **Marriotts** placed a sign outside saying, "The Hot Shoppe." Within two years, they had bought out their partner and had opened two new restaurants.

Company Profile

The Marriott Corporation now serves an average of a million people every day and employs 60,000. Operations include more than 400 public restaurants, 34 hotels and resorts, airline catering kitchens, food service management contracts with 200 businesses and institutions, two major theme parks, three cruise ships, condominiums, and a world travel bureau. The company's facilities are located in 39 states of the U.S. and in 18 foreign countries.

In 1977 the corporation marked its 50th Anniversary. The founders—**J. Willard Marriott** and his wife Alice—are still active. He

continues as chairman of the board and she is a vice president and director.

Their eldest son, J.W. Jr., assumed the presidency in 1964, and became chief executive officer in 1972. Their second son, Richard E., is corporate vice president heading the company's Restaurant Operations Group.

"I guess my greatest satisfaction has been in building a first class company with top notch people," **Marriott** commented. "We've done everything with the best ingredients, whatever it's been. There is no greater satisfaction to me than helping people grow and prosper as employees and individuals. The results are loyal, dedicated employees and beautiful hotels, restaurants and flite kitchens."

The company's history in many aspects has paralleled the development of modern transportation, with innovation by management to keep pace with the mobility of society. In 1927, **Marriott** was first with drive-in food service east of the Rockies . . . and first again in 1937 with an independent airline catering kitchen.

Hot Shoppes and Airline Catering

When the Great Depression came **Marriott** was operating four Hot Shoppes. He soon began to expand outside the Washington area.

"We had a Hot Shoppes right across the 14th Street Bridge from the new Hoover Airport," he recalled. "At first, people came over to buy sandwiches and other snacks to take on the planes. Then we put together box lunches which the airlines bought for their passengers. After that, we began to develop hot food items—keeping the food heated with a hot brick—for Eastern, Capitol and American Airlines."

After Pearl Harbor Hot Shoppes helped in the cause by managing food operations at five Defense Plants in the D.C. vicinity. By the

end of the 1940's there were nearly 20 Hot Shoppes, and In-Flite catering had spread to new markets beyond Washington.

One year after Roger Bannister broke the four-minute mile barrier in 1954, the company opened its first post-World War II health care and educational feeding accounts, in Washington, thus paving the way for the modern day development of food service management.

A New Lodging Concept

A new lodging concept—a combined hotel and motel to be called a motor hotel—was introduced by **Marriott** with the 1957 opening of its first property, the Twin Bridges Motor Hotel, in Washington. This momentous opening hearkened a new market for **Marriott** that was to spread across the nation and, eventually into foreign cities.

"Most motels throughout the county were 'Ma and Pa' operations," he said. "And there weren't many along main highways. In Washington, you had to go downtown to the Mayflower or Washington Hotel to find a quality facility."

"But being at one end of the bridge, we figured that people coming in and out of town would stop there. Originally, we didn't plan any convention facility . . . it was supposed to be an overnight, or two-to-three day tourist lodge."

"We even had an outside drive-in registration desk so people wouldn't have to get out of their cars to sign in. We weren't sure what to call the facility—a hotel or a motel. We ended up calling it a motor hotel."

Since then, Marriott Hotels have grown to include over 14,700

company-operated rooms and another 3,300 franchised Marriott Inn rooms, located in most major cities in the United States, Mexico and in the Caribbean. The first European hotel (Amsterdam) has been opened, and the first Middle East hotel (Cairo) is under construction.

Diversification

Throughout the 60's, and 70's, Marriott diversified as needs for food service away from home changed. Today the company covers the full spectrum of public restaurant offerings. In limited menu service it has Roy Rogers Family Restaurants. In coffee shops it has the Big Boy chain. In the ice cream-food-and-fun concept it has Farrell's Ice Cream Parlour Restaurants. There are also moderate-price Hot Shoppes Restaurants and Cafeterias and a variety of fine dinner houses.

In 1976, after five years of development, the company became a major operator in the theme park industry with the opening of two "Marriott's Great America" family entertainment centers. Located in the two major metropolitan areas of San Francisco and Chicago, the parks feature a variety of live entertainment, thrill rides, unique shops, food facilities and games in five American-heritage-themed areas.

There are also a stock-purchase plan and incentive bonuses that reach right down to all unit managers, whether they run a coffee shop or a Jr. Hot Shoppe.

These policies have helped keep Marriott nonunion. By keeping the unions out, Marriott feels it gains tremendous flexibility, which is worth more than money.

Marriott, The Man

Marriott is a fourth-generation Utah Mormon. He was born in Marriott, Utah, on Sept. 17, 1900.

His father entrusted him with a trainload of sheep to San Francisco when he was 14, and from then on he grew in independence. He served the obligatory two years as a Mormon missionary before he turned 20, traveling in New England, then returned to Utah and worked his way through Weber College and the University of Utah selling long-john underwear to loggers.

He is known as a deeply religious man who gives 10 per cent of his income to his church. He also pushes himself hard. "No person can get very far in this life on 40 hours a week," he once said.

He collapsed in 1933 with a disease of the lymphatic system and his doctors gave him two years to live. He spent six months fishing, hunting and riding in Maine and Florida, then returned to his business and confounded the physicians.

Employee Relations

As they built their work force the Marriotts sought enthusiastic cheerful people who were interested and cared about the service they were providing. Their theory was to develop a strong employee relations program feeling that satisfied employees make for satisfied customers.

From highest to lowest, Marriott employees are cut into a profit sharing trust after three years. Those employees who invest regularly in Marriott's plan (employees may contribute up to five percent of salary, while the company kicks in eight percent of its pre-tax profits).

Honors and Activities

He has served as a director of American Motors Corporation and several other major companies. He holds honorary Doctor of Law degrees from Brigham Young University and the University of Utah, and an honorary Doctor of Humanities degree from Weber State College in Utah. He is a former president of the National Restaurant Association.

He has many civic religious and

charitable accomplishments to his credit. He was selected by President Nixon to be chairman of both the 1969 and the 1973 Inaugural Committees. Both events are recognized as the most successful, artistically and financially, in the history of the Inaugural.

He is executive chairman of the Honor America Committee, a national organization to promote Americanism and organized, within a few weeks, the group's first religious/partiatic celebration in Washington, D.C. on Independence Day, 1970. That special observance, attended by 450,000 people at the Lincoln Memorial and Washington Monument, was watched by millions on national television. Rev. Billy Graham and Bob Hope were national chairmen.

He has long been a leader in the Mormon Church and was President of the Washington Stake for nine and-a-half years. The Marriott Library at the University of Utah and the beautiful Marriott Activities Center on the Brigham Young University Campus are among the many monuments, large and small, to his charitable spirit.

In his lifetime J. Williard Marriott has demonstrated as well as any living American that hard work and dedication, along with love and inspiration, are still very much part of the "American Dream."

California Phi Oldest Living Tarzan

In 1923 a fellow law student introduced **James H. Pierce** (Indiana '20) to the daughter of Edgar Rice Burroughs, author of *Tarzan*. The meeting changed his entire life.

He not only fell in love with Joan Burroughs and married her in 1928 but her father decided to cast him in the first feature length high budget Tarzan motion picture, "*Tarzan and The Golden Lion*."

Pierce, now retired and living in Apple Valley, California, is now the "oldest living Tarzan."

"Rich And Famous"

"Mr. Burroughs saw me at a swimming pool party at his ranch and exclaimed, 'You are the man I always imagined as Tarzan,'" **Pierce** recalled. He had the studio contact **Pierce** and, as a result, he got the part. "I was to be paid \$75 per week with a promise that I would become rich and famous as the result," **Pierce** said.

That first picture, which was produced by Joseph P. Kennedy (the father of John F.), was not successful because it came out when talkies were new and, unfortunately, it was silent. Many producers were reluctant to make the change to sound because they felt the talkies wouldn't make it. They were dead wrong.

So **Pierce** did not become "rich and famous" but he did lay claim to giving the greatest Tarzan yell of all time. On the first day of shooting the director ordered him to run by the camera in his leopard skin. "I was barefoot for the first time in 20 years and when I stubbed my toe on a rock I let loose a blood curdling scream that could be heard for miles around," he remembered. Of course there was no sound track so the yell did not go down in movie history.

Soon after the picture was finished, Burroughs gave **Pierce** the rights to a Tarzan book to make into a film. He later sold the

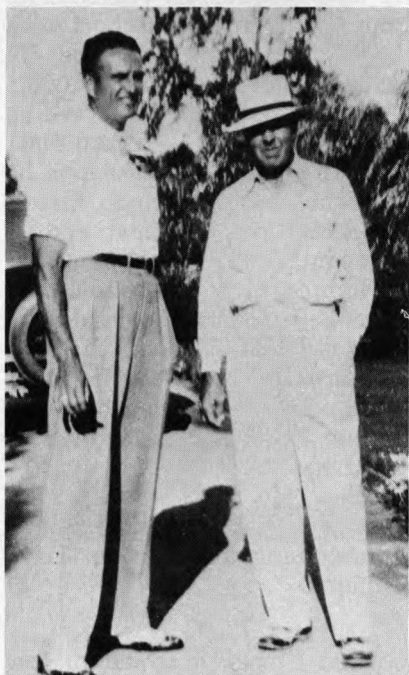
rights to MGM, who had suddenly discovered Johnny Weismuller. Weismuller did become famous in the part.

"I had a hard time getting on in the movies after that," he said. "Producers seemed to think that I was part ape. They knew I might be able to lift an elephant but doubted if I could spell it.

"My greatest prize in playing Tarzan was wooing and winning Joan. From the moment we met it was just like a fusion of two electric currents. We were married at the Burroughs Ranch in Tarzana on my birthday, Aug. 8, 1928."

The Radio Series

Radio was beginning to come of age at this time and Burroughs came up with the idea of teaming Pierce and Joan in a recorded series. Up to that time all shows were live. "It caught on like wild fire," he exclaimed. "We recorded almost four hundred shows during the next five years. It played in just about every country and small island in the world."

The aspects of the role differed in motion pictures from the radio. "The only movie that ever followed the book was the one I made," he stated. "Mr. Burroughs had script supervision and he saw to it that it followed the story. The radio program also followed the story and characters as written."

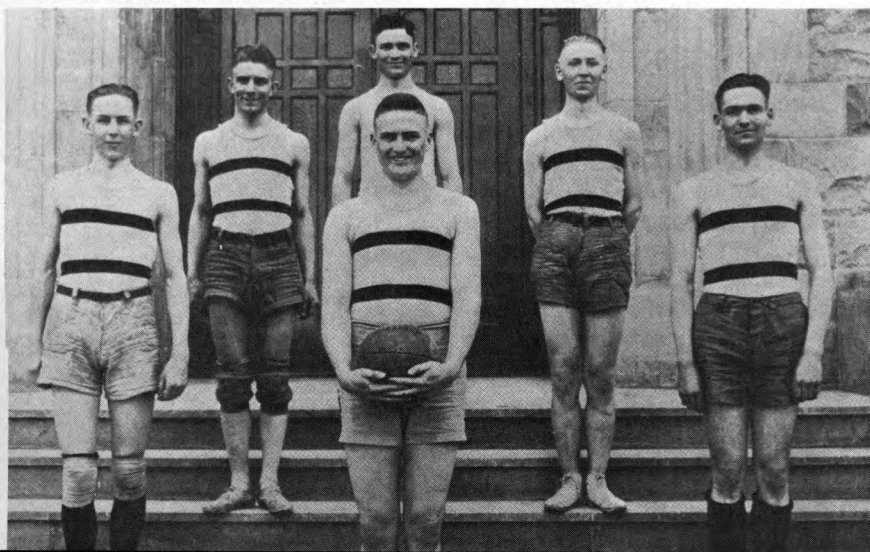
"Tarzan was played as intelligent and not the grunting oaf 'Me Tarzan, you Jane' movie producers have always made him out to be. After all, he was the son of Lord and Lady Greystoke, English nobility from whom a giant ape had stolen the baby Tarzan in the African jungle."

After the radio series finally wound down Pierce returned to the movies playing in many Westerns as the "heavy." One of his more notable roles was as Frank James, brother of Jessie James in "The Life of Jessie James."

New Directions

He later became interested in flying and qualified as a commercial pilot. In 1941, when World War

II broke out, he was offered and accepted a contract from the government to operate a flying school in Arizona to train pilots.

In 1964 he and Joan retired in Apple Valley. Both loved golf and they built a home adjoining a country club. He described Dec. 30, 1972, as a day when "the worst tragedy of my life happened." Joan was stricken suddenly with a heart attack and passed away suddenly the next day. Pierce and his two children, Joanne and Mike, were thrown into a state of shock. "Most of all I shall never forget that feeling of finality," he said. "I am lonely, but not in an unpleasant, depressed way, because there are so many pleasant memories to fill the gaps between the past and future."

An Indiana Phi

Pierce was born at Freedom, Indiana in 1900. He joined Phi Delta Theta in 1917 at Indiana University. Sherman Minton, then chapter president, presided at his initiation. Minton went on to the United States Senate and later became a member of the Supreme Court. "My membership in Phi Delta Theta has given me great pride for 60 years," he stated.

He was a center on the varsity basketball team while in school and did a stint in the Army during World War I before returning to I.U. to graduate.

While an assistant athletic director and coach at Arizona University he helped organize Arizona Alpha in 1922. From Arizona he moved to California where his coaching career was to be sidetracked by the movies.

The ex-Tarzan is now writing his memoirs. "I feel I have been blessed and honored to have had the opportunity to act out one of the world's greatest fantasies," he said. "I have been part of this phenomenal legend for over 50 years."

"All people live with fantasies to escape the hum drum of reality. From childhood days of playing cops and robbers, we carry vicariously into adulthood, such characters as Tarzan." ■

Hackenberg Selected Phi Of The Year

Aloysius T. Hackenberg (North Dakota '46), an insurance executive with Northwestern National Life in Grand Forks, North Dakota, has been named winner of the **Raymond L. Gardner Award** as "Phi of the Year" for 1977.

Presentation of the award was made this spring. He was nominated by North Dakota Alpha.

The award is presented each year by the Seattle Alumni Club in memory of **Raymond L. Gardner** (Washington-Seattle '18), a member of the General Council from 1952 to 1956. It is presented annually to an alumnus who best exemplifies the teachings of the Bond through participation in fraternity affairs, activities in higher education and community service.

Hackenberg, who worked his way through college as a bus boy, volunteered to head up the drive to build a new house for North Dakota Alpha in October, 1975, at an estimated cost of \$440,000 to \$470,000. At the time, he said that it was at least a 10 year commitment.

To date he has raised \$190,000 cash, plus approximately \$125,000 in future cash pledges, \$60,000 in insurance beneficiary pledges and \$40,000 in wills bequests to date.

He has sent out approximately 8,500 letters and news reports in conjunction with the drive and has written some 600 individual letters

to Phi alumni.

It is estimated that this volunteer job requires a minimum of 10 hours per week. Despite this **Hackenberg** continues to be one of the top producers for his insurance company. He has 14 years insurance experience and has delivered more than \$18,000,000 of life insurance, \$3,000,000 in 1976 alone. He was named the outstanding North Dakota Agent for Northwestern in 1976.

The "judge" as he is called, completed his B.A. and J.D. degrees in five years at North Dakota, earning Phi Beta Kappa and Phi Eta Sigma honorary awards. He also holds membership in Phi Alpha Delta law and Phi Delta Phi history fraternities.

He practiced law in Williston, N.D., for 10 years and then served as a county and city judge for 6½ years and as assistant states attorney for Williams County (North Dakota).

He has been a lecturer for three insurance courses at the university and is past president of the Grand Forks Association of Life Underwriters. He has been taking at least one insurance educational course every year since he gave up his law practice 15 years ago and has completed all chartered life underwriter courses.

The "Phi of the Year" has been married for 22 years to his wife, Delores and they have nine children, five boys and four girls. His first of five sons expect to start attending college this coming fall. His oldest daughter is a member of Kappa Alpha Theta at North Dakota.

An active church worker, **Hackenberg** is a lay reader and communion distributor for St. Michael's Catholic Church in Grand Forks. He is past grand knight, district deputy, state membership chairman and state advocate for the Knights of Columbus and has been named three times as the

Outstanding North Dakota agent for the Knights.

He is also active in other community affairs serving as troop chairman for Boy Scout Troop No. 5. He is on the Mayor's Advisory Committee and is a past president and current director of the Lions Club. He is a 27-year member of the Elks Lodge and a life member of Moose Lodge.

Hackenberg was named "Outstanding Young Man of the Year in Williston for 1956 and was first runner-up, North Dakota Outstanding Young Man of the Year, 1956.

Born and raised on a North Dakota farm, he attended country grade school during the depression. He was graduated as Valedictorian from Williston High School with the highest average in the 80-year history of the city of 12,000.

At North Dakota he served as a varsity basketball student manager. In North Dakota Alpha he was scholarship chairman, historian, scrap book chairman and an active intramural participant.

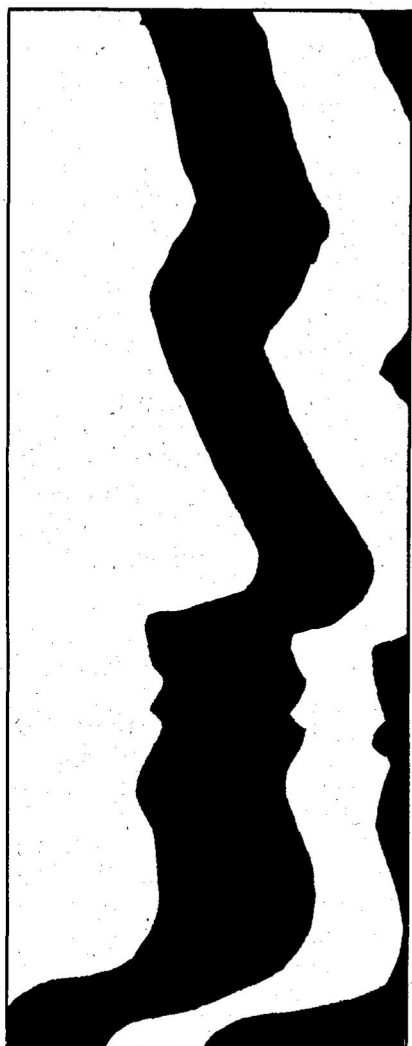
Alumni club activities in Grand Forks have occupied a considerable amount of his time for the past 15 years. He served as vice president, public relations chairman, Chapter Grand committee member and Legacy Rushing committee member. He has been a regular speaker at rushing dinner and at Homecoming and Alumni Days reunions. ■

Profile: The Phi Delt General Officer



This report is taken from a thesis submitted by Robert J. Miller to the faculty of the College of Business and Public Administration in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Master of Business Administration at Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton, Florida. The thesis entitled "Fund Raising in Non-Profit Fraternal Organizations" was copyrighted August, 1977.

What are the qualities which, when combined in the proper portions and mixed with appropriate care, guarantee a successful General Officer of Phi Delta Theta? No one really knows the answer to that question, possibly because there is not one single reply. In a recent study, it was learned that Phi Delta Theta's Province Presidents, Commissioners, Trustees and General Council members, all of whom serve without pay, come in all shapes and sizes, a wide range of ages and from a variety of professions.

The age of the General Officers ranges from 27 to 78 with a median of 44.

Only 8 percent of the officers failed to graduate from college, while 92 percent had obtained at least the equivalent of a bachelor's degree. Of the total group, 22 percent had earned a master's degree and 20 percent had obtained a doctorate.

Occupation designations range from agriculture to wholesale lumber, with the heaviest concentrations being in legal work, business sales, various fields of education and insurance. There was also a significant number of retired persons.

Over a third of the general officers (37 percent) have incomes in the \$20,000-\$35,000 category. An annual income of less than \$20,000 was recorded by 20 percent, while 15 percent indicated annual earnings of \$60,000 or more.

Prior to becoming general officers, 70 percent of the respondents served as chapter officers, 58 percent as alumni club officers, 48 percent as chapter advisers and 48 percent as house corporation officers. Obviously, many have served in two or more of these capacities.

Ninety-two percent of the general

officers have contributed financially to their respective colleges, while 86 percent have given financial support to their house corporations, 84 percent to their chapters, 68 percent to the general fraternity's loyalty fund and 62 percent to the educational foundation.

When asked about their attitude toward a variety of fraternity programs, 76 percent felt that more job placement information should be made available to the members and 62 percent favored more alumni club activities.

One hundred percent of the officers indicated that they read the fraternity journal, *The Scroll*, 64 percent of them thoroughly, while 30 percent read some parts of the magazine and only 6 percent skim over it lightly.

The final question on the survey provides some insight as to why these men give unselfishly of their time, often at personal sacrifice in the form of time away from business and family, to serve the fraternity. No one word, no single sentence, can adequately summarize the replies. Even to attempt to categorize is difficult, but we found a great many responses using phrases like "fellowship with other Phis," "friendship of the brotherhood," "rewards of association" and "a bond with other men that cannot be explained."

Of equal importance was the obvious opportunity to serve young men and old. This was described by such comments as "helping youth as an alumnus is a great reward," "close communication with young people," "personal satisfaction in working with young men," "opportunity to work with undergraduates," "inspiration from working with young people," "excitement of working with others" and "opportunity to associate with men of exceptional accomplishment." ■

Profile: The Phi Delt Living Alumnus



This report is taken from a thesis submitted by Robert J. Miller to the faculty of the College of Business and Public Administration in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Master of Business Administration at Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton, Florida. The thesis entitled "Fund Raising in Non-Profit Fraternal Organizations" was copyrighted August, 1977.

This study is based on the results of a questionnaire mailed to 1,000 persons, selected at random by computer from approximately 87,000 living alumni members of Phi Delta Theta Fraternity.

The members were notified that all replies would be held in confidence. In fact, there was no way of identifying the participant unless he signed his name to the survey or envelope. It was recommended that the questionnaire be returned anonymously.

Age

The youngest respondents, three in number, were twenty-two years of age, while the oldest was eighty-four. The largest age category, 25 percent, came from the age group of thirty to thirty-nine years, followed by the decade of fifty to fifty-nine years, with 23 percent. However, the median age is forty-five.

In view of the fact that the survey was sent to only persons who were no longer pursuing an undergraduate degree, the first decade of ages twenty to twenty-nine is smaller than might be expected, in view of the fact that most students remain in college until at least their twenty-second birthday.

Education

Less than 5 percent of the respondents have failed to graduate from college, while 95 percent have obtained at least a bachelor's degree. Better than 30 percent have worked their way to the master's degree and beyond, with 11 percent obtaining a doctorate. Perhaps one misleading factor in these statistics is the inconsistency of degrees granted by various law schools. In one case, the graduating law student is granted a master's degree, while in other

institutions, he is awarded a doctor of laws degree. Even so, the total percentage for master's degrees and above would hold true at over 30 percent.

Occupation

One of the key questions in the investigation was felt to be the inquiry as to the person's current occupation. Answers to this query ran the usual gamut one would expect from a sample of college graduates. There were a few students in the lower age group who were pursuing graduate degrees and there was a high percentage of retired persons in the sixty and above age categories.

Three digit codes were utilized covering 118 occupations and these, in turn, were condensed into nine general categories.

Fifteen respondents failed to indicate an occupation. Of those who responded, the highest percentage (44 percent) came under the title of business services, better than doubling the second highest category of the professions, with 27 percent. Retired respondents were listed third with 17 percent.

Income

By far, the greatest number of respondents fall in the \$20,000 to \$35,000 income category, with 43 percent. The under \$20,000 category accounted for 29 percent, with the balance being pretty evenly distributed in categories above \$35,000.

Service as an Officer

The survey under study sought to determine if a person had rendered service to the Fraternity as an elected or appointed officer

in several areas of service. Sixty-three percent of the respondents indicated that they had served as an undergraduate chapter officer. Less than 2 percent had acted in the appointive office of chapter adviser, while 6 percent had been elected to a chapter house corporation board and 10 percent had served as an alumni club officer.

Participation in Fraternity Sponsored Functions

An important part of undergraduate education is the system of province meetings sponsored by the general fraternity through its area officers. Although chapter officers are encouraged to attend such meetings, any chapter member may do so. The survey indicated that 12 percent of the persons answering this question had attended a province meeting as an undergraduate.

A similar meeting, designated as the chapter officers conference, was attended by 8 percent of the respondents. The fraternity's general convention is open to all initiated members without regard to position. Almost one fourth of the persons answering this question indicated prior attendance at an international convention.

Financial Support —

College and Fraternity

Disregarding the replies where the questions in this category were not answered, we learn that almost three fourths of the respondents have given financial aid to their respective colleges. Nineteen percent indicated that financial support had been given to the house corporation, the incorporated body which holds title to the fraternity house where the individual attended college. Fifty-one percent indicated that financial donations had been given directly to the chapter

of initiation.

Gifts to the general fraternity's loyalty fund were made by 31 percent of the respondents, while only 9 percent had made contributions to the tax qualified educational foundation of the parent organization. Almost 90 percent of the respondents indicated knowledge of the foundation's tax status.

Bequests —

Chapter and Fraternity

Six percent of the respondents indicated that they had considered making a bequest to the educational foundation through their wills, while 20 percent favored a similar bequest for their chapter of initiation. By contrast, 36 percent of the respondents felt that they might include their alma mater in their wills.

Fraternity Programs

In responding to the question concerning fraternity programs, 54 percent of the members indicated an interest in additional information concerning job placement, far outperforming the next general area of interest, group travel programs, which garnered 31 percent. Not far behind were more alumni club activities, with 28 percent, automobile insurance programs, at 23 percent, and a graduate degree program, also with 23 percent. The suggested Encyclopaedia Britannica discount plan garnered a very poor 6 percent and less than 4 percent suggested programs other than those listed.

Magazine Interest

Sixty-five percent of the respondents in the survey indicated some interest in the fraternity's magazine, *The Scroll*. Although only 3 percent stated that they read the magazine thoroughly, 16 percent attest to being particularly interested in certain parts

of the magazine and the publication is skimmed, at least lightly, by 47 percent. Unfortunately, the survey also shows that nearly 35 percent of the respondents discard the magazine without reading it.

Opinion ran two to one among the respondents in favor of continuing the undergraduate chapter news section of the magazine. When asked if there would be objection to the publication taking on a newspaper format as opposed to the usual magazine style, the respondents disapproved by a vote of 85 percent to 15 percent.

Other Benefits

Seventy-five percent of respondents, volunteered information under the open question of "What benefits do you feel you personally receive as a member of Phi Delta Theta Fraternity?" The comments were overwhelmingly favorable, with such comments as fellowship, brotherhood and friendship being the prevailing theme. The one phrase which kept appearing referred to the value of "life-long friendships," which had been established within the fraternity chapter.

Respondents quite often referred to their pride of membership in an international organization which they felt was recognized as one of the leading college organizations. Also mentioned were educational benefits, such as learning social graces, developing leadership techniques and just plain learning to live with other persons.

On the other hand, there were those who felt that there were no, or very few, benefits of membership for an alumnus member. In such cases, however, the respondent usually went on to qualify his answer by adding an additional word of explanation. ■



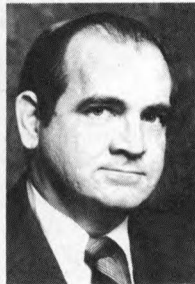

was a member of the "Class Before Class One" of Army liaison pilots who established the basis for organic Army aviation after their graduation in early 1942.



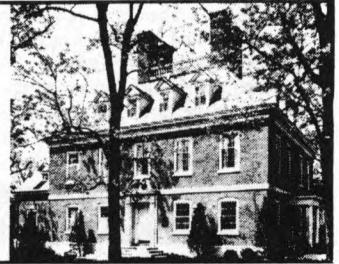

Panels discussions, which took up most of the morning of Feb. 5, concentrated on the role of the province president. The topics included "Outline of the Position",

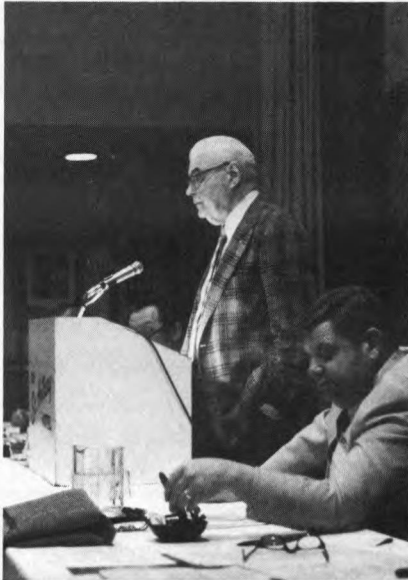

LOS ANGELES

Paul F. Conrad (Iowa '50), whose national following as a daily cartoonist (*Los Angeles Times* and its syndicate) has produced strong echoes about his international and domestic interpretations, was Founders Day speaker before the Los Angeles Alumni Club on Friday, March 3, 1978.

The place was the Jonathan Club in downtown Los Angeles, the attendance of 110 Phis from 27 chapters came from various areas of Southern California, and when **Conrad** concluded a talk spiced with highly individualistic recollections and viewpoints, all the Phis present had liked it so much that everybody stood and applauded. Brother **Conrad's** topic was "When in

the Course of Human Events," and it was a wide topic, widely and cuttngly covered.

The speaker was as unstinted in his comment as his brush when applied to his cartoons, which draw many "letters to the editor" in Los Angeles, some full of enthusiasm and others expressing ruffled feelings.

The Founders Day of 1978 reflected something historic for Phi Delta Theta and Los Angeles. It was within two months of the 100th birthday of the chapter application of the original club of Phi Delta Theta alumni of the Los Angeles vicinity, dated May 1, 1888, organized through the efforts of Will H. Anderson (Southwestern 1886), W.D. Buckner (Randolph-Macon 1879) and B.H. Wise (Virginia 1887), and signed by nine other Phis from eight other chapters. (Walter B. Palmer's History of Phi Delta Theta, 1906: page 519).

That first Phi Delta Theta Alumni Club in Los Angeles was formed, reorganized and re-chartered May 18, 1898, with 18 more brothers' names added to the original 12, and the Los Angeles chapter of 1978 still follows the successive 100 and 90-year old charters.

Some of this historic nature of the occasion slipped by unannounced, but there were flashes from bygone years when four Golden Legion awards were conferred. These 50-year Phis were:

Alfred S. Taylor (Oregon '31) who signed the Bond on Jan. 22, 1928,

William L. Schaefer (Miami-Ohio '31), Feb. 14, 1926;

Jean McGraw, (DePauw '31), Feb. 22, 1928; and William C. Bryant, (South Dakota '31), March 11, 1928.

Bill Bryant received his Golden Legion badge from Bill Bryant, Jr., (South Dakota '66), his son. The pair represented two of the three generations of this South Dakota Phi Delta Theta family, the original being Carl Bernard Bryant (South Dakota '07).

Bob DeWeese, (Southern California '50), president of the Los Angeles alumni, conducted the program. Vice-President Phil Gainsborough (USC '6), made introductions.

Province President Jim Seirra, (Cal State Northridge '68), reported things bright and pleasing in Omicron Province South, with particular promise from the restored California Gamma at Univ. of California in Los Angeles.

Twenty-nine members, one pledge, considerable notice about the campus, and all of this backed by spirited chapter alumni are, the spokesman said, putting together a leasing corporation that will take steps toward a new chapter house future for UCLA.

President Doug Smith imparted good news about California Delta at USC, and Don Gersbach (California State Northridge '78) said that chapter, with its silver stars for excellence in 1976 and 1977 now has another in prospect for 1978; possesses 53 active members, 12 Phi-keias, and \$5000 cash "looking for a deal for a piece of land."

During Conrad's talk, he confided that the start of a major career as newspaper cartoonist began with sketches drawn in the Phi Delt house at Iowa City. He went on from there to the *Denver Post* and the day by day attention of the newspaper public which now follows him in the *Los Angeles Times* and its syndicate.

One of Conrad's laughs came when he told the Phis that "some have questioned whether Miss Lillian could have gotten Billy and Jimmy Carter's birth certificates mixed up."

He also said that Bert Lance seems the only American who today can make money off the Arabs, and that "any cartoonist, is only as good as his next day in the newspaper." —George Shaffer

First Five All-Phi Choices Repeaters

All five of last year's Honorary All-Phi basketball selections repeated this year with four of the five being unanimous choices.

Rick Walker ('78) and Tim Evans ('78), Puget Sound seniors, are three-time selections and paced the team in scoring this year with 17.8 and 18.5 averages through a 28-game season. Both made the all-time Phi Delt Honor Roll of over 1,000 points as Walker had 1,946 career points and Evans had 1,929.

Walker also made the Honor Roll with a 38-point single game out-pot against Portland State and he made the single free throw percentage Honor Roll exceeding 85% with 87%, hitting 86 of 98.

This pair from Washington Delta, with career totals of 3,875 points, are tops in fraternity basketball history. Evans also gained 175,872 Pizza Hut Classic All-Star points.

Repeating at center was Kim Stewart (Washington-Seattle '78), whose career was cut short when he injured a knee requiring surgery for ligament and cartilage damage in the 18th game of the year against defending NCAA champ, Marquette.

Through those 18 games he was the Huskies leading scorer. He also made the all-time Honor Roll with 927 career points and 623

career rebounds plus receiving 126,882 Pizza Hut points.

The fourth unanimous choice was Guard Jerry Marifke (Northwestern '79), who led his team in assists and had top offensive performances of 17 against Illinois and 15 against Michigan. "Gus" Schrader (Iowa '46), sports editor of the *Cedar Rapids Gazette* and member of the selection board, remarked that, "I saw Marifke play against Iowa and he was terrific to super."

The final first team spot went to Bill Caskey (DePauw '78), who was named to the NCAA Division III All-South Regional All-Star team although his team lost. He did make the all-time Honor Roll with 915 career points and 726 career rebounds.

Pacing the Honorary Second Team are a pair of unanimous choices, Bob Thompson (Knox '78), a forward and chapter president, and John Ridall (Denison '79), a repeater at guard.

Thompson, through a 20-game season, was his team's leading scorer with a 13.5 average and also the leading rebounder with 165. His top three games were 21 points in each contest against Carlton, Coe and Chicago. He was selected by his teammates as "Most Valuable Player."

Ridall, team captain, carried a 14.5 scoring average and led his team in scoring in 13 of 18 games.

He was the team's MVP as a sophomore and again this year.

At center was Andy Pritchard (Franklin '78), who was edged from the first team by Caskey. Pritchard was his team's leading scorer with 385 points for a 15.4 average. He also had 201 rebounds through a 25-game season and was selected to the NAIA District 21 All-Star team. His top single game performance was 32 points. He made the all-time Honor Roll with 838 career points plus 467 rebounds.

Completing the team are Bruce Turner (Allegheny '80) and Doug West (Franklin '79), who was a unanimous choice. Turner carried an 8.3 average with 92 rebounds in a 20-game season. His team finished second in the President's Athletic Conference with a 10-4 mark.

Hugh Durham (Florida State '59), a member of the All-Phi Basketball Board for the past 10 years and coach at Florida State, recently accepted the head basketball coaching position at the University of Georgia. He ended the 1977-78 season with a 21-4 record and a 12-year overall mark of 230-95.

1977 Contributions Set New Records

Once again, Phi Delta Theta's loyal alumni have set records, both in the number of contributions (8,538) and the total amount of money contributed to the Fraternity's Loyalty Fund (\$133,631.71) and the Educational Foundation (\$51,023.70). As a result, many important programs have been made possible in areas which might have otherwise been neglected.

As the principal of the Educational Foundation increases, the trustees are able, through sound investments, to award more and/or larger scholarships to deserving students. The reader's attention is called to a special report on this topic which appears in the Winter 1977-78 issue of *The Scroll*. In 1977, 20 scholarships with a total value of \$12,400 were presented. A similar number will be awarded in 1978 and it is anticipated that the total value of scholarships awarded will increase in 1979 as a result of greater income from the increased corpus of the fund.

Increased income to the Loyalty Fund, on the other hand, is expended for current operations. The addition of one additional chapter consultant, made possible in large measure by alumni gifts, has met with enthusiasm by undergraduate members. The increased frequency of Chapter Officer and Adviser Conferences has brought methods of sound chapter administration to a greater number of undergraduate officers and chapter advisers.

The increase in alumni support has also contributed to the return of Phi Delta Theta to the campuses of McGill University in Montreal, Quebec and the University of Wisconsin at Madison, while plans continue to develop to return to additional campuses where chapter doors closed in recent years. Meanwhile, the search continues for desirable campuses where the Phi Delta Theta banner may be planted.

Concurrently, special attention has been given by the General Headquarters staff to those chapters with special problems and opportunities. For example, a dozen chapters which were deemed to be in serious jeopardy at the beginning of the year have shown significant improvement and are on their way to obtaining a satisfactory rating.

The accompanying charts will be of interest to all alumni, particularly those whose chapters and/or age groups are represented. It should be noted that our older alumni maintain a higher percentage of support, both in number of donors and average size of gifts. However, the total value of their contributions is overshadowed by the younger alumni who are far more numerous.

Each of the class years from 1912 through 1929 reflects a percentage of contributors of at least 20 percent. At least 10 percent of the members in the classes of 1930 through 1940 are contributors. With the exception of three class years (1971-73), all classes from 1941 through 1976 show a minimum participation of 5 percent. All percentages are based on the total number of brothers solicited for a gift in each graduating class.

Several chapters are worthy of special recognition for the records they established in the 1977 fund drive. Our mother chapter at Miami University led the field in the total number of donors, followed by the chapters at the University of Florida (est. 1924) and Ohio State University (est. 1883).

In the total value of gifts, the alumni from the University of Oklahoma chapter, founded in 1918, led the pack, followed by chapters at the University of Kansas (est. 1882), Miami University (est. 1848) and the University of Missouri (est. 1870). The record should also show that the alumni of our University of Mississippi chapter presented special centennial gifts of \$1,000 to the Loyalty

Fund, \$500 to the Educational Foundation and \$500 to the Frank J.R. Mitchell Scroll Endowment Fund.

Younger chapters (with fewer alumni) also earned special recognition. The Nevada Alpha chapter founded in 1972 at the University of Nevada led all chapters in the average gift per contributor, followed by chapters at the University of Manitoba (est. 1930), University of Alberta (est. 1930) and Florida State University (est. 1950).

The leading chapter in the highest percentage of participating alumni is the now inactive New York Delta chapter, established at Columbia University in 1884. It was followed by the chapters at UCLA (est. 1924), Miami University (est. 1848) and the University of California - Berkeley (est. 1873).

In the final analysis, these chapters are just the tip of the iceberg and beneath the surface are several thousand alumni who contributed to our call for help to repay in some measure all that the Fraternity has done for them in previous years. To all these we extend a warm, brotherly word of gratitude — **THANK YOU!** ■
