

Phi Hostage Returns From Iran

Alan Bruce Golacinski (Maryland '72) was one of the 52 American hostages released in January after 14 months of captivity in Iran.

He was greeted by family, neighbors, friends, teachers and acquaintances when he finally returned to his suburban neighborhood in the Woodmore section of Silver Spring, Md. on Jan. 28 following a parade through Washington, D.C.

"What this has done for America made it all worthwhile," he told the hometown crowd. "I'd do it all again . . . I love you all."

The 30-year-old Phi was sent to Iran as a regional security officer. He has been a State Department Security official since 1974 and previously served in Argentina, Chile and Morocco.

Born in Vienna, Austria, he attended Northwood High School in Silver Spring and received a B.A. in Criminology from Maryland in 1972.

His mother, Pearl, is a French teacher at Montgomery County School System. He has two brothers and two sisters.

Members of Maryland Alpha followed his ordeal in Iran intently for more than a year. "We sent him quite a few cards in Tehran whenever the Iranians allowed us

to send them," John Richardson ('82), a government and politics major, told *The Diamondback*, university newspaper.

Golacinski's firm delivery of a Christmas message, broadcast in December, reassured the Phi Deltas who heard it, Richard said. "He seemed like he was hanging in there pretty tight."

Mark Hubbard ('81), chapter president, reported that a group of brothers went into the nation's capital to watch the ticker tape parade. "We pointed to the Phi Delta Theta letters on our jackets when the busses carrying the hostages passed," he said. "We noticed Alan and he returned our greeting.


"It was a thrilling experience and we are so proud to be Phis at this time."

The hostages were liberated after 444 days in confinement that began with the seizure of the U.S. Embassy by student militants. U.S. Deputy Secretary of State Warren Christopher was on hand to first greet the hostages when they arrived in Algeria.

That was just the start of what would be over a month of celebrations and reunions for the hostages. Golacinski was literally mobbed by hundreds of school children and well-wishers when his motorcade finally rode onto University Boulevard in his hometown.

His mother and two sisters, Linda and Danielle and fiancee, Nancy, had trouble getting through the line. A neighbor who had lived in the community since 1947 observed that "It's never been like this."

It probably never will be again.

GM Chairman Hopeful For Future

(NOTE: The following is taken from remarks by Roger B. Smith, chairman of the General Motors Corporation at the Dallas, Fort Worth Economic Outlook Conference in Dallas on Jan. 27, 1981.)

We Americans have, I believe, learned hard lessons. And that is a major reason why I am so optimistic in looking at the future. Today, our country seems poised to move in new and more promising directions. And if we make the right moves — if we sustain them — a new era of robust growth and economic vitality could be opening up to us very soon.

I don't want to sound simplistic. I am no Pollyanna. I

Roger B. Smith (Michigan '47) was elected chairman and chief executive officer of General Motors Jan. 1. He also became chairman of the corporation's finance committee.

Prior to this he had served as an executive vice president of General Motors and a member of the board since Dec. 1, 1974. He had responsibility over the operating staffs, public affairs and finance groups.

Born July 12, 1925, at Columbus, Ohio, he was graduated from Michigan with a B.A. in business administration in 1947 and received his master's degree in business administration there in 1949.

He joined GM immediately following graduation as a member of the comptroller's staff in Detroit. After a series of promotions, he became director, general accounting section, in 1958. He was transferred to the treasurer's staff in New York in 1960, as director of the financial analysis section. He was named assistant treasurer in 1967 and promoted to general assistant treasurer in November, 1968.

He was named treasurer in March, 1970, and one year later was elected vice president in charge of the GM Financial Staff and a member of the Corporation's Administration Committee. He held that post until elected group executive in charge of the Nonautomotive and Defense Group on Jan. 1, 1972.

am fully aware of the enormous difficulties we face — difficulties that have been compounding themselves over many years.

For example, while Japan and West Germany and much of the rest of the world were rebuilding after World War II, the United States seemed to be un-building. Government spending, for example, now represents about one-third of our GNP — nearly twice as much as it did in the early years after World War II.

And American industry has been buried under a heavy burden of regulatory costs. General Motors alone — just one company — now spends about \$2 billion a year in complying with these regulations. You can imagine what that does to our ability to compete against lower-cost Japanese products.

And as far as the nation's energy policies are concerned, you Texans should know more than anybody else how much inefficiency and waste these policies have

been creating over the years.


In the wake of these and other misguided governmental policies, it is not surprising that national productivity has slipped dramatically from its traditional 3% average. Over the past five years, it has been wallowing around 1%. And our underlying inflation rate has ratcheted up from 1% in the early Sixties to 11%.

Now, obviously, it is clear that there is a great deal wrong with our economy. And change for the better will be neither easy nor painless. But, nevertheless, there is a sound basis for optimism. The American electorate will not tolerate a continuance of past mistakes. Thanks to public pressure, there appears to be bipartisan support in Congress for budgetary restraint. And judging from the Chrysler loan agreement, even organized labor seems ready to cooperate. I have no illusions that translating this newly-found fiscal religion into specific and constructive action will be easy. But given the wide support for governmental restraint, I am more than hopeful.

Excessive Regulation

Take the regulatory area, for example. Before leaving his post as Secretary of Transportation, Neil Goldschmidt let off this parting shot about the American automobile industry: he said, "Government has loaded the cost of social and environment regulation onto automakers without a careful examination of the total cost or the cumulative effect. Moreover, we have allowed an adversarial relationship to dictate the terms of our dialogue. I don't believe we can allow this to continue." I, for one, consider that very encouraging recognition of the problem.

Also, the Stockman-Kemp paper — entitled "Avoiding a GOP Economic Dunkirk" — sets



forth some equally encouraging and specific proposals to reduce the burdens that have been imposed on automotive manufacturers. Stockman-Kemp estimate that \$10 to \$20 billion in operating and capital costs can be saved without any adverse effect on social benefits. And this can be achieved simply by rescinding some of the new regulations scheduled to impact the auto industry during the 1981-84 period.

Finally, and most important of all, President Reagan has been quoted as calling for a "temporary moratorium on all future auto regulations, and a careful review of current regulations . . ." He also called for a major effort to improve the Clean Air Act to allow job-creating industrial expansion and to give companies a choice of ways to meet the rules.

Turning to the energy area, some steps have already been taken to dismantle the misguided policies of the past. There are many signs that the new administration will call for the immediate decontrol of all petroleum prices and for a speed-up in the decontrol of natural gas. In fact, in the newspaper this morning David Stockman described decontrols as being "fairly imminent."

In short, there very definitely appears to be a broad consensus of support in Washington and elsewhere for the adoption of more enlightened economic policies. If we keep that firm resolve, and if these corrective policies are adopted, there is no doubt in my mind about the long-term outlook for the nation's economy. It will be extremely bright. By controlling government spending and by adopting sound regulatory and energy policies, we will lay the foundation for our country to assume once again its preeminent position in the global economy.

Many Clouds Remain

Unfortunately, many clouds still remain. Even if corrective public policy decisions are im-

plemented without delay, the legacy of prior governmental excesses will still be dragging at our economic heels. Inflation, for example, will probably not fall much below a 10% rate by year's end. At least, that's our opinion.

There is also the matter of the Federal Reserve's commitment to a stringent set of monetary growth targets. Under such restraints, we can hardly look for the robust growth that usually follows a recession. In fact, some forecasters are concerned that the Federal Reserve's restraints on monetary expansion will bring the emerging recovery to a screeching halt or, worse yet, produce a "double dip" recession in 1981.

We don't think this will happen. It's true that continued high interest rates could further depress business — especially the automobile and construction

businesses. The risk is high. We're all concerned. But I have confidence in the new administration and the new Congress. I am convinced that credible and balanced anti-inflation policies will bring interest rates back to more modest levels — and in the not too distant future — within a matter of months, in fact.

I say that because it is inflation — both current inflation and the expectation of future inflation — that is the principal factor underlying the unprecedented surges in interest rates. It is not a magic wand being waved by the Federal Reserve. This is a popular misconception — and the sooner it is discredited, the better. It's true that the serious operational difficulties experienced by the Fed last year led to more volatile interest rates — but that was and is only a temporary problem.

No, whatever mistakes the Fed

may have made last year, it did not pull our present high interests rates out of a hat. Those rates are largely the result of the inflationary environment in which we have been living and operating. The recent and sad experience of the United Kingdom stands as an object lesson for all of us. The burdens our American economy is now bearing will become absolutely intolerable unless our monetary policy is supported by regulatory reform and by sound fiscal policies.

To be a little more specific, the Fed's task of controlling the money supply has been seriously complicated by the federal government's continuing insistence on running up huge budget deficits. This practice must stop, and we take heart in the new administration's determination to do just that. The highest priority must be given to keeping the budget in balance over the business cycle — with surpluses in years of expansion and deficits in years of recession.

Tax Reductions

This does not rule out the advisability of reducing taxes this year. I hasten to point this out. In fact, to delay such action could make matters worse. As Paul McCracken recently said: "The strategy of holding off on any tax action until the budget is balanced is simply leading us down the road to yet higher levels of public spending and budgets chronically in the red."

Various tax reduction plans have been proposed. Properly handled, we believe the best of them can be implemented without adding significantly to the budget deficit or putting inordinate pressure on interest rates. The trick is to cut taxes in unison with cut in government spending. A dollar-for-dollar relationship is not essential, nor is absolute, lock-step timing. It is far more important to success that the government establish credible policies capable of convincing all participants in our financial markets that outlays and receipts

are moving towards a state of balance. In this connection, Chairman Volcker of the Federal Reserve recently said — and I quote: "There is a strong positive case for tax reductions in terms of productivity as long as the government does not flinch from making offsetting budget reductions to hold down the federal deficit."

We at General Motors strongly agree that a tax cut is needed — especially one that provides substantial capital spending incentives retroactive to January 1 of this year. Our corporation is committed to a \$40 billion investment program through 1984 — an awesome sum. The tax policies adopted this year will be an important factor in our ability to meet this challenge on schedule. And, in turn, our ability to meet our investment schedules will decide GM's ability to compete

effectively here and abroad.

In the same way, a convincing case can be made for individual tax relief. The burdens of rising social security taxes, bracket-creep, and the effects of the so-called "windfall profits" tax, are already intolerable for many. Given our inflationary problems, however, we must move discreetly. Our policy instruments — fiscal, monetary, and regulatory — must be used in a synchronized and balanced manner. To implement them one step at a time would be counterproductive.

What all of this boils down to, of course, is that we Americans and the leaders we have chosen in government have many extremely important decisions to make in the near future — some of them in the very near future — some of them as soon as tomorrow. But I think the signs are positive. I think there is ample evidence that we Americans have learned from

past mistakes. We are moving in the right direction.

Looking more closely at what 1981 is likely to bring us, this is what we see: Given the expectation of a more stable Federal Reserve policy; given comparatively modest economic growth; and given a slight improvement in inflationary expectations, interest rates are likely to descend further this year. With the underlying inflation rate likely to remain close to 10%, interest rates will be high in a purely historical context, yes — but they'll ease sufficiently to allow business activity to expand moderately.

New Car Sales

While I'm still on this point, let me say something about new car sales and the effect that interest rates have on them. Our dealers are feeling the greatest strain — much more so than the customer. In fact, the average monthly payment customers make rose about \$20 between December of 1979 and December of 1980. Thus, even with higher finance costs and higher vehicle prices, these average monthly payments represent about the same proportion of family income as they did a year ago — and if you go back three years, you'll find that today's car payment takes less of a bite out of family income than it did then.

Most people don't seem to know that the interest paid on a new-car loan is currently less than the prime rate — by about five percentage points. And here in Texas, GMAC's average retail rates are more than 6 points lower than the prime. So, you Texans are in a privileged position — as usual.

My point is clear — nobody should let current interest-rates scare them out of buying a new car — especially a new General Motors car! I'll be glad to talk business with anyone here before I leave — and I can promise you the best deal in town!

But, to get back to the economy, we look for real GNP

growth of about 2% between the final quarter of 1980 and the last three months of this year. Even though much of this growth is likely to occur after July, we think that's highly encouraging.

Also encouraging is the state of business inventories — at least outside of the automobile industry. They're still in close alignment with sales. This steadiness, coupled with forecasts that real capital spending will rise moderately in 1981, makes us believe that a so-called "double dip" recession is not in the cards this year. Some temporary leveling in real growth may occur in



the initial months of the year — but by springtime we think you will see the economy regain its forward momentum.

With respect to the automotive outlook, the annual rate of deliveries is expected to strengthen as we go through the year and exceed 14 million units in the fourth quarter, compared to a current annual rate of just under 12 million. Thus, we at General Motors anticipate new vehicle deliveries in 1981 of at least 13 million units, compared to 11½ million in 1980.

Now, let me try to pull all of these strings together and come

to some sort of a conclusion that is brief and that makes sense. First, let's stop looking for someone to blame for current high interest rates. Let's start working together. We have met the enemy, and it is not the Federal Reserve or anyone else — it is excessive government spending, it is budgetary deficits. And it is inflation.

1981 In Perspective

Demand, as far as 1981 is concerned, we don't think it's going to go down in history as a great or even outstanding year. But it won't be a bad year, either. Far from it. It promises to be a year of improvement from the disappointing performance of 1980,

and, most importantly, it promises to be a year of learning from past mistakes.

If we adopt programs that support private initiative, if we curtail the upward spiral in government spending and regulation — if we do these two things at least — we will succeed in setting the foundation of a revitalized economy. And once again the preeminence of the United States will be restored — in the world of economics and in international business competition. Our preeminence will be recognized, and it will be turned loose to the benefit of every American — Texan, Michiganian, and everyone else! ■

Albert Smith Newest Phi Delt Congressman

Albert Lee Smith, Jr. (Auburn '54) is Phi Delta Theta's newest member of Congress. He was elected to the House of Representatives in the November elections bringing to ten the number of Phis in the House (see *Scroll*, Spring, 1981, p. 45).

In 1978 he ran for the House from the 6th District of Alabama in the Republican Primary against a seven-term incumbent and received 42.5% of the vote. This time he was successful.

He is a Chartered Life Underwriter for Jefferson Standard Life Insurance Company in Birmingham and has been with the company 24 years. He is also a qualifying member of the Million Dollar Round Table.

He was president of the Birmingham Association of Life Underwriters in 1964 and in 1979 was Program Vice President of the Estate Planning Council of Birmingham.

The new Congressman has been active in the Republican Party since 1962, serving as poll-watcher, precinct captain, vice chairman of finance for the party in his county, and a delegate to

In addition, he is member of the Birmingham Advisory Board of Campus Crusade for Christ.

Born and reared in Birmingham, he attended public schools there and graduated from Auburn in 1954. He was commissioned an officer in the U.S. Navy and served two years on board a destroyer escort.

He is married to the former Eunie Walldorf of Chattanooga and they have three children—Karen, Albert and Meg.

Alabama Suspended For Hazing Violations

The charter of Alabama Alpha at the University of Alabama was suspended by the General Council in February for violations of the Fraternity's law prohibiting hazing. The action came at the Council meeting in Tampa, Florida, on Feb. 19 and was announced at the General Officers Convention on Feb. 21.

In addition the Council voted to suspend the charter of the Florida Gamma chapter at Florida State University pending completion of an investigation into charges that the chapter has violated the law regarding hazing.

The Council also agreed to conduct an investigation into charges of hazing which have involved the Washington Beta chapter at Whitman College and the Indiana Kappa chapter at Ball State University.

The Alabama action will be reviewed at the May meeting of the Council, provided that (1) the chapter officers supply the GC with a certified copy of by-laws which specifically include non-hazing provisions, (2) the adviser of the chapter has been replaced, (3) the chapter has met with a member of the Council to review plans for the ultimate return of the charter and (4) the Council is provided with a written positive pledge education program.

Other highlights of the meeting included the approval of the campus of the University of California, San Luis Obispo, as a site for colony development, and the establishment of this year's awards committee to consist of Province presidents Bob

Schuemann, chairman, Jake Marino and David Runyon.

The Officers Conference was opened on Feb. 21 with Billy Stitt, member-at-large of the GC, presiding. It included reports from the General Council, the *Scroll*, the Scholarship Commissioner, the alumni Commissioner, the Palmer Foundation, the Educational Foundation, the Survey Commission and the Community Service Day Chairman. The officers were then broken into three groups to discuss fraternity problems. The entire body came back together later in the day to

report on their discussions.

Don Mason, chairman of the Educational Foundation, announced that the number of \$1,000 scholarships for 1981 will be increased from 28 to 30. He pointed out that there were 54 applicants last year.

Glen Cary, newly appointed chairman of the Survey Commission, announced that three locations were currently being considered for colony status—Austin College (Texas), the University of Northern Iowa, and California Poly.

The meeting was concluded on Feb. 22.



As the Phi Delta Theta solicitation program matures, varying sources of income are having an impact on the grand total.

For example, income from estate gifts has begun to show an increasing percent of total dollars in recent years. There appears to be increasing emphasis on memorial gifts to the Foundation and, although the dollar amount is not great in relation to total funds received, there appears to be a definite trend toward more gifts in this category. Then, too, continued emphasis on the various giving clubs appears to be having a significant impact when one notices that membership in the larger clubs is increasing an-

nually by significant percentage points, while the number of small donors is decreasing at a very low rate.

The Founders Club was established some years ago to recognize those persons who made a contribution of \$10,000 or more to the General Fraternity. Such a gift could be made in one lump sum or in installments over a period, not to exceed ten years. The year 1980 saw the addition of two names to this list: Brothers Maurice E. Shaffer, (Dickinson '30), and Jack S. Kitchen, (Missouri '39). These two brothers join W.H. Sterg O'Dell, (Iowa State '40), who became the initial member of the Founders Club in 1972.

Ferrara Paces All-Phi Cage Team

Mike Ferrara (Colgate '81), Colgate's all-time leading scorer with 1,763 points and the second leading scorer in the NCAA this year with a 28.6 average, paced Phi Delta Theta's *All-Phi* basketball selections for 1980-81.

A unanimous choice, Ferrara had three single game performances this year of 50, 42 and 40 points. He replaced Phi Ernie Vandeweghe (Colgate '49) as his school's leading scorer.

Two other unanimous choices on the first team are repeaters Dan Hastings (Wisconsin '81), team captain, and Seam Touhy (Mississippi '82), SEC assist leader. Hastings had a 5.5 scoring average with a top game of 14 against Iowa and 11, including 7 free throws, in the final minutes to upset Indiana, the eventual NCAA champion.

Touhy had a 5.0 scoring average and had the top playing time on the team. He had 135 assists to lead the conference and, through his junior year, has a career total of 563. He led the Rebels to their first NCAA post-season tournament.

Completing the top five are repeater Eric Brewe (Puget Sound '81) and Ralph McPherson (Texas-Arlington '82), a transfer from Texas Tech. Brewe led the fifth-ranked NCAA Division II team with a 17.2 average plus 149 rebounds. He has been named to the Phi Delt All Time Honor Roll with 1,222 career points.

The second team is paced by another trio of unanimous selections. They are repeater Tony McWhirter (Whitman '82), with a 13.9 scoring average and 189 rebounds; newcomer Rob Albert (Ohio Wesleyan '82), who had a 12.4 scoring average plus 113 assists; and newcomer Rick Elliott (Richmond '81), a three-year letterman with a 3.5 scoring average, 2.4 rebound average and 73 assists in 25 games.

Completing the second five is repeater Jacques Tuz (Colorado '82) and Larry Frevert (TCU '81). Tuz

had an 8.0 scoring average plus 86 rebounds and the third most minutes of playing time on the team. His top games were 14 points in a win over Oklahoma and 11 points, 7 of them in the last two minutes, in a win over Long Beach State.

Frevert was edged from *All-Phi* honors last year by two Phi Delt teammates who transferred to other schools this year. He had a 5.1 scoring average plus 123 rebounds. His top game was 14 points and 10 rebounds against Houston and 10 points and 7 rebounds against Texas.

Special mention should go to Ken Rosemond (Richmond '81), a 6-9 center-forward who has played in every contest for three years, and Dave Nelson (Washburn '83), who scored 100 points and had 88 rebounds this past season.

Nelson Remembered For Record

Bert Nelson (Butler '32), a Golden Legionnaire, clearly recalls Feb. 1, 1930, when he and his Butler teammates traveled to South Bend, Indiana, for a duel meet with Notre Dame. He was rated one of the top high jumpers in the country but his best mark was 6'4".

"I don't know why it all came together that day," he said but I just felt good and for some reason my peak form. It was one of those rare days that an athlete experiences a feeling that he can do anything."

Nelson high jumped 6' 6 3/4" to break the World Record by 1/2". The previous record had been set four years earlier by Harold Osborn of Illinois. The first person to greet him after he landed was Knute Rockne, the Notre Dame football coach

an All-American basketball star and also played with the New York Knickerbockers in the 50's . . .

RANDY RAYMOND (Nebraska '81) an All-Phi, Track Honor Roll selection, was second in the pole vault at the NCAA Indoor Championship with a vault of 17' 4 3/4", which establishes a new fraternity record for the pole vault event . . . **KEN KRAVAC** (Ashland '73), a former All-Phi Baseball Honor Roll selection who was the ace of the Chicago White Sox staff in 1979 with a 15-13 record, was traded as

who was at the meet. "I had no idea I was breaking a world record," Nelson said. "I was stunned completely by the happenings. It was so ordinary, no press, no radio, No TV. After the meet instead of returning to school, I left by myself and took a bus home to Chicago."

"My dad didn't think track meets were a very important activity and when I showed up at home he thought I was up to some mischief and he wanted to know why I wasn't in school. I told him he would understand when he read the *Chicago Tribune* the next day and of course he took the clippings from the paper everywhere he went".

The record was all the more unique because Nelson used a technique all his own. It was called the Nelson Roll in which he ran straight at the bar, then threw his right leg up and rolled as he crossed over the bar falling into the pit.

Back in school at Butler, Nelson was asked to give demonstrations of his high jump at the remaining basketball games of the season. Nelson went on to win the NCAAs high jump title in 1932 and he later held the National Intercollegiate record at 6' 8 1/2" . . . now considered just a good leap for an above average high school jumper.

Nelson wanted to be a sports writer in his collegiate days and his desire was to work for the *Chicago Tribune*. But upon his graduation from Butler in 1932 in the height of the depression, he had a job at the Indianapolis Light Company so he stayed on there for 41 years until he retired in 1971. In this issue of the *Scroll* we salute Brother Bert Nelson, our 74 year old Golden Legionnaire Phi and former World Record Holder in the high jump of 50 years ago.
